1. Farm reports:

- Family farm report
- Multiannual farm report (5 years time serie)
- Benchmarking farm report

2. Benchmark report
3. Standard Results reports (different levels of aggregation: Poland, FADN region, family farms, legal entities, organic farms)

Methods of data dissemination: Researchers

1. Standard Results reports (different levels of aggregation: Poland, FADN region, family farms, legal entities, organic farms);
2. Time series available on-line on Polish FADN website;
3. Methodological studies, i.e. on typology of agricultural holdings, unit costs, selection plan, etc.;
4. Specific studies on selected issues, i.e. incomes of agricultural holdings
5. Micro data on different level of aggregation: raw data, aggregated data, Farm Return, Standard Results.

Methods of data dissemination: Policy makers

1. Standard Results reports;
2. Specific studies on selected issues, i.e. incomes of agricultural holdings;
3. Ad-hoc analysis on different levels of impact: Poland, specific sector. Experts' reports - incl. forecasts.

Ways of improvement

1. Lectures and presentations
2. Development of on-line data access
3. Extending the number of farms collecting FADN data – training environment for farmers and schools;

Ways of improvement

4. Main concerns:

- Farmers – how to encourage them to use FADN data?

/make FADN data more usable and relevant in daily farm management: unit costs calculation, early access to financial reports like cash flows, benchmarking on demand, lower the burden to farmers – access to administrative data of Paying Agency/

- Data collectors – how to help them to work with the farmers?

/they need to be well-trained, reliable – farmers look
